Materials

- 1 skein of bulky weight yarn (approximately 100 yards)
- Size 10 (6 mm) knitting needles
- Yarn needle

Gauge

4 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch

Finished Size

Approximately 6 inches wide by 60 inches long

Instructions

- 1. Cast on 24 stitches.
- 2. Knit 2, purl 2 across the row.
- 3. Repeat Row 2 until the scarf measures approximately 28 inches long.
- 4. Begin the keyhole detail by knitting 8 stitches, then casting off 8 stitches. Knit across the remaining 8 stitches.
- 5. On the next row, cast on 8 stitches over the stitches that were cast off in the previous row. Knit across the remaining 16 stitches.
- Repeat Rows 4 and 5 until the keyhole detail measures approximately 4 inches wide.

- 7. Continue knitting in stockinette stitch until the scarf measures approximately 60 inches long.
- 8. Bind off all stitches.
- 9. Weave in any loose ends.

Tips

- Be sure to check your gauge before you begin knitting. This will help you to ensure that your scarf is the correct size.
- If you are new to knitting, I recommend watching a few tutorials on YouTube before you begin. This will help you to learn the basic stitches and techniques.
- Don't be afraid to make mistakes. Everyone makes mistakes when they are first learning how to knit. Just rip out the stitches and start over.
- Have fun! Knitting is a great way to relax and be creative.

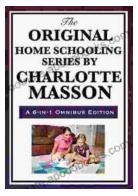


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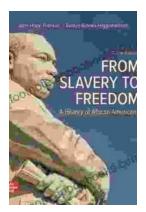
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
